### WEETON AND DISTRICT AGRICULTURAL & HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY GENERAL RULES 2018

- The sole object of this Society is for the benefit of the Community and the improvement of Agriculture, Horticulture and livestock breeding and all proceeds are to be devoted to these objectives.
- 2 All exhibits, except in the case of any open classes which may be arranged, shall be the work or product of the Exhibitor resident in the Show district. The show district comprises an area 5 miles radius of the Showground and includes the parishes of Harewood, Kearby, Arthington, Kirkby Overblow, Pannal, Beckwithshaw, Stainburn, Leathley, Pool, Eccup, Bramhope, Burn Bridge, North Rigton, Sicklinghall, Follifoot and Dunkeswick.
- Only entry forms completed in full and signed, accompanied by the correct entry fee and a large self-addressed envelope will be accepted. Entry fees will not normally be refunded unless the circumstances are considered exceptional.
- 4 All exhibits to be the property of the Exhibitor on the date of entry published in this schedule. The Society reserves the right to publish the results by any means available, including the use of photography.
- 5 All exhibits, except those allocated to special times must be staged not later than 10.00am on the day of the Show.
- 6 The organisers accept no liability whatsoever for any damage to any exhibits.
- 7 The Society will not be responsible for incorrect classification of exhibits staged on or before the day of the Show.
- 8 No exhibit shall be removed from the Show before the conclusion of the presentation of prizes, but it shall then be removed by the Exhibitor within the time announced by the Committee, all exhibits not cleared away within such time shall become the property of the Society for disposal.
- 9 If in any livestock classes, there are less than four entries, then the third prize in that class shall be withheld.
- 10 Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry in any single class.
- To determine the "bona fide" of an Exhibitor, the Executive Committee is empowered to appoint a Sub Committee to inspect the garden or land of such exhibitor either prior or subsequent to the Show.
- 12 No exhibitor shall be allowed within the Show marquee during the time of judging.
- The judges shall be empowered to withhold the awards of any or all the prizes in any class, if in their opinion, the exhibits in that class do not attain a sufficiently high standard of merit
- Any objection by any exhibitor relating to any exhibit or exhibits must be made in writing and lodged with the Secretary before  $3.00\,\mathrm{pm}$  on the day of the Show and be accompanied by a deposit of £10.00 which will be refunded should any objection be sustained or adjudged to be based on reasonable grounds. All disputes shall be investigated by the Committee and its decision shall be final and binding.
- Prize money will be paid personally to the winning Exhibitor after 3pm, on the day of the Show.
- For distinguishing the professional from the amateur gardener for competition in the Sections for Flowers and Vegetables, anyone who by garden labour or the sale of garden produce makes their livelihood shall be deemed a professional and shall only be entitled to enter in the professional class; and anyone who employs a full time professional gardener shall also be restricted to that class.
- Exhibitors with more than one entry in a class only gain points for the Trophies on one exhibit which has gained the highest award for them.
- Any Exhibitor infringing these rules shall forfeit their entrance fees and any prize money which may have been awarded to them.
- Each Trophy shall be held for one year under a guarantee that it will be delivered to the Trophy Secretary, 5 weeks before the Show in good condition, new engraving completed and that in the event of its loss or damage the appropriate amount of its value or repair to be made good to the Secretary by the holder.
- 20 Competitors in all sections should read the rules specific to that section, which appear at the beginning of those classes.



## HORSE & PONY CLASSES

### RULES FOR ALL HORSE AND PONY CLASSES INCLUDING SHOWJUMPING PLEASE READ AND KEEP

- Closing date for on-line and postal entries strictly <u>SUNDAY 22<sup>nd</sup> 2018</u>. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THIS DATE – NO EXCEPTIONS. PLEASE NOTE THAT NO ENTRIES FOR SHOWING CLASSES WILL BE TAKEN ON THE DAY. SHOW JUMPING ENTRIES CAN BE MADE ON THE DAY.
- This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at the East of England Showground 8<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> August 2018. The two highest equines not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify. The Equifest card is now the responsibility of the competitor and you must bring it with you. The show is also affiliated to The Showing Register North East Regional Final 20<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> October 2018 at Countryside Live, Great Yorkshire Showground, Harrogate.
- 3 Entries of £8 (excluding medical fee) or more will entitle the competitor to one gate entry ticket; entries over £16 (excluding medical fee) will entitle the competitor to a maximum of two gate entry tickets. Gate entry tickets will not be posted for entries received after the closing date. Anyone without a gate entry ticket will be charged for entry to the showground; advance gate entry tickets can be purchased at a discount. Please see entry form.
- 4 Please ensure you have read the General Society Rules. Further information is available on the website www.weetonshow.co.uk
- 5 No postal entries accepted unless accompanied by correct entry fees and large letter first class stamped addressed A5 or larger envelope for returning numbers. If you have not received numbers by 27th July please email one of the Horse Events Team.
- 6 Competitor numbers must be worn at all times when mounted on the showground. No one falling off in the ring will be allowed to remount.
- Protective Headgear ALL riders of horses and ponies on the showground or exercise areas are required to wear head protection (hard hat) that conforms to the following revised standards for head protection for equestrian activities: All PAS015, VG1, (BS)EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. Correctly secured Skull Caps/Riding Hats that meet one of the following current Safety Standards/specifications MUST be worn by all Riders between the ages of 15 to 17 inclusive. All PAS 015, VG1, (BS)EN1384 2017, ASTM F1163 04a onwards, SNELL E2001, SNELL E2016, AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards. The most recent additions to the list are the addition of SNELL E2016 and EN1384 (2017), the
  - newest version of the EN1384 Standard will begin to appear during 2018 and is also added to the list. Helmets must be worn with the chin straps correctly and securely fastened at all times whilst mounted. This applies to all ridden competitions, demonstrations and whilst exercising.
- 8 There is a compulsory payment of £2.00 for each competitor to cover the provision of medical services.
- 9 The organisers accept no liability whatsoever for any accident, damage, injury, illness to horses/owners/riders or any other person or property. All entrants do so at their own risk and as a condition of entry competitors must declare that they hold a minimum third party liability insurance.
- 10 No lunging allowed anywhere on show ground, warm up in horse designated areas only, remember many of the spectators are not used to horses.
- 11 All stallions or colts, of 3 years or over, must wear a bit or chifney at ALL times whilst on the show ground."
- 12 Objections must be made in writing to the General Secretary with a deposit of £10. See Society Rule 14.
- 13 All cups and trophies are to be returned to the Trophy Secretary 5 weeks before the show. See Society Rule 19.
- 14 The Society will not be responsible for incorrect classification of exhibits. Please declare eligibility for specific special prizes on entry form.

- 15 Judging will start in each Ring promptly on completion of the previous class. Competitors are advised to be on the field early, as it is impossible to say how long each class will take. Class timings are estimates only and subject to change. It is the competitor's responsibility to ensure that they are on time for their class and to ensure that the classes which they are entering do not clash with others. Judges will not wait for you.
- 16 If there are less than five entries in any one class then only the winner of first place will receive prize money in that class. Rosettes will still be awarded down the line in accordance with the particulars of each class.
- 17 Competitors are reminded that they should carry horse passports at all times.

#### DRESS AND TURNOUT FOR RIDDEN SHOWING CLASSES

#### HORSE

- a) No tack may be worn which in any way conceals an animal's conformation.
- b) No rugs, clothing or item of tack that reveals the identity of a horse or owner may be worn in the show ring.
- c) Martingales are only to be used on Working Hunters
- d) The complete bridle must be plain leather.
- Swales, Sam Marsh bits and Gags with double bridles are actively discouraged. Bitless bridles are not allowed. Four and five year olds should be ridden in snaffle bridles.
- f) Lead rein ponies to be led by an attendant and shown in a snaffle bridle. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband only.

#### **RIDER**

- g) Anyone on a horse must wear a skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved standard defined in the Horse & Pony rules at all times when mounted. Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover.
- h) Riders must wear an appropriate jacket with a shirt and tie, tweed coat for men. Tweed coat or plain blue or black coat for women.
- i) Plain fawn or buff coloured breeches, not white
- j) Plain black or brown boots, garter straps optional
- k) Spurs are optional but at all times must be of smooth metal. There must be a shank, pointing only towards the rear, which must be no more than 3.5cm long and without rowels. The end must be blunt and incapable of wounding a horse. If the shank is curved, the spurs must be worn only with the shank directed downwards.
- I) Any form of leather or string glove
- m) No earrings or visible jewellery should be worn
- **n)** It is the responsibility of exhibitors to ensure that grooms entering the Show Ring are smartly and professionally turned out.

- 4 YOUNGSTOCK IN HAND Open to all breeds
- RESCUED AND REHOMED open to any rescued equine. As well as official rescues, this includes those which have been abandoned, obtained or bought in a neglected/maltreated state and those saved from being destroyed by retraining. The equine may have been rescued by a charity and then re-homed with its current family. Entries should include brief details of the equine's history. "Before" photos would be useful but not essential. **In-hand or ridden**. Horse, pony, donkey or mule. Judging will be based on confidence, manners, condition and performance in company and in an individual show not exceeding two minutes. Judging will take account of the improvement in the animal since rescue.
